Why BYOD?

BYOD means Bring Your Own Device to school. BYOD has been developed to enhance student learning and teachers have been trained to incorporate innovative experiences using technology in the classroom. Access for All

We understand that not all parents can or want to send a personal device to school. The choice is yours. The board has invested in technology to ensure that every student has access to a device.

Through BYOD our teachers support students in learning to use devices safely, effectively, ethically and respectfully. Securing Devices

If you are comfortable sending a personal device with your child to school, please be aware that responsible use and securing the device is the responsibility of your child. If you feel the personal device is not safe at school, then it should remain at home. Teachers have a plan to assist in keeping personal devices secure; however, ultimately students are responsible for lost, stolen and/or damaged personal devices.

Students will use devices to access the internet via the BHNCDSB network. Our network has been optimized to provide

Cell Phone/Device Responsible Use Guidelines and Acceptable Use Policy

Purpose:

St. Joseph's Catholic Elementary School uses instructional technology as one way of enhancing our mission to teach the skills, knowledge and behaviours students will need as responsible citizens in the global community. Students learn collaboration, communication, creativity and critical thinking in a variety of ways throughout the school day. St. Joseph's Catholic Elementary School will allow personal devices such as cell phones, smartphones, IPods, IPads, or tablets on school grounds for students who follow the responsibilities and guidelines stated in this **Acceptable Use School Policy**.

Guidelines:

- 1. Students must adhere to the BHNCDSB Student Information and Technology Communications Use Agreement.
- 2. Each teacher has the discretion to allow and regulate the use of personal devices in the classroom and on specific projects.
- 3. Approved devices must be in silent mode on school property, unless otherwise allowed by a teacher.
- 4. Headphones may only be used with teacher permission. Walking down the hallway with headphones being used is not permitted. External speakers are permitted only at the discretion of the classroom teacher.
- 5. Devices may not be used to look up answers on assignments, quizzes, or tests.
- 6. Devices may not be used for non-instructional purposes on school property during instructional times which includes making personal phone calls, text messaging, and accessing social or gaming media.
- 7. Devices may not be used to record, transmit or post images or video of a person or persons on school property during school activities or school hours unless allowed by a teacher for the purpose of an assignment or lesson.
- 8. Devices may not be used in any areas where an expectation of privacy is anticipated (washrooms, change rooms, etc).
- 9. Devices may not be used outside during scheduled breaks. Inside use during breaks is allowed only with the classroom teacher's permission.

Students and Parents/Guardians acknowledge:

- 1. Personal devices should be charged prior to school and run on battery power while at school. Charging devices will not be permitted at St. Joseph's Catholic Elementary School.
- 2. Each user is responsible for his/her own device and he/she should use it responsibly and appropriately.
- 3. St. Joseph's Catholic Elementary School takes no responsibility for stolen, lost or damaged devices. While school staff may help students to keep personal devices secure, students will have the final responsibility for securing their personal devices.
- 4. Parents who need to contact their child during the school day must call the office. Students needing to contact their parents during the school day must do so through the office. If use of cellphone to contact parents is absolutely necessary, students will ask the teacher for permission before using their personal devices so they aware of the situation.

Consequences for not following guidelines:

- 1. First offence The personal device will be confiscated by the staff member and returned to the student at the end of the day.
- 2. **Second offence** The personal device will be confiscated and turned in to the office. Parent will be called to meet with the principal and the device will be returned to the parent. The device will not be allowed at school for one week.
- 3. Third offence The personal device will be confiscated and the student will lose permission to bring the device to school for an extended period up to and including the remainder of the school year.

Note: The Administration team will decide the specific consequences based on the nature of the infraction and may also lift any suspension of privileges based on the student's demonstrated readiness to take responsibility for the device
